Legislative Update

P.A. 24-5: AAC Changes to the Paid Family and Medical Leave Statutes

- Passed Senate and House with bipartisan support
- Key components of P.A. 24-5:
 - 1. Clarifies definition of municipality in CT Paid Leave and CT FMLA
 - 2. Makes explicit employers' responsibilities regarding registering, remitting contributions, and submitting payment return files
 - Clarifies what other state or federal benefits will not require denial of CT Paid Leave if they are received concurrently
 - 4. Requires health care providers to display CT Paid Leave information



- Key components of SB 222 (continued):
 - 5. Allows the Authority to charge interest if an individual does not pay a penalty or repay overpayments in a timely manner
 - 6. Changes date of CT Paid Leave's annual report from 7/1 to 9/1
 - 7. Establishes a procedure for tribes to participate in CT Paid Leave
 - 8. Revises the CT Family Violence Leave Act (31-51ss) to include victims of sexual assault
- Effective 10/1/24
- *Provision changing annual report to 9/1 is effective upon passage



Additional bills of interest

- S.B. 220: An Act Concerning Clarifying the Appeals Process Under the Paid Family and Medical Leave Statutes
- S.B. 391: An Act Implementing the Recommendations of the State Contracting Standards Board
- H.B. 5005: An Act Expanding Paid Sick Days in the State
 - Expands CT's existing paid sick days law to cover most workers by 2027
 - Outreach opportunities to highlight differences between paid sick days and CT Paid Leave
