Discussion about what The Alliance does and how it helps the survivors of sexual violence and how the Rowan Center, as part of the Alliance, treats survivors of sexual violence.

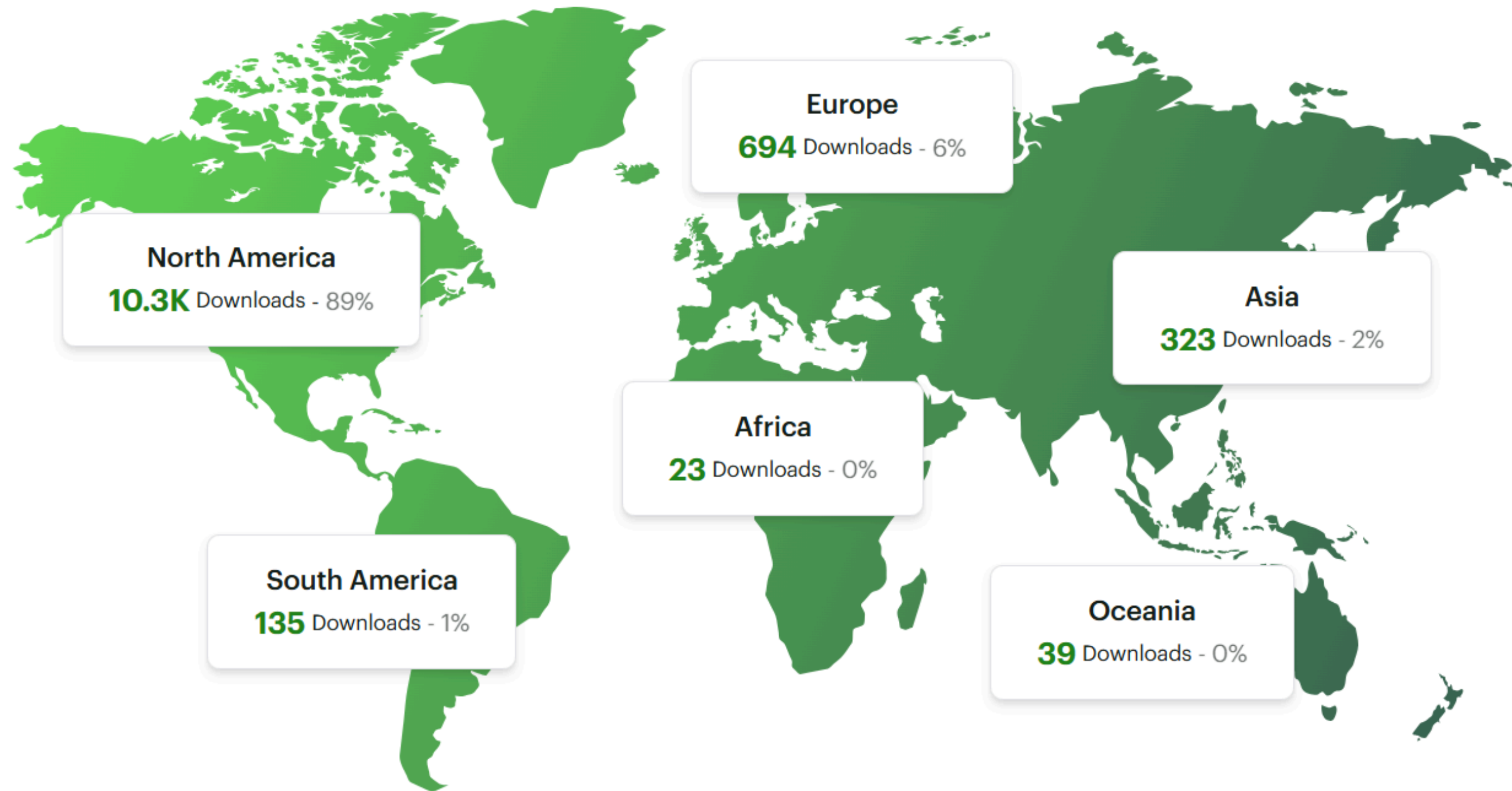
